

Rebuilding the Urban Edge

In 1974, redlining, real estate speculation, and displacement of lowand moderate-income families were tearing at the fabric of Boston communities. Determined resident opposition succeeded in halting the extension of I-95 through the City, but the urban landscape sustained the scars of cleared land, with large tracts devoid of homes and businesses.

Market pressures and gentrification threatened the racial diversity and economic life that had evolved over generations. Boston community leaders came together and founded Urban Edge to rebuild and revitalize these damaged neighborhoods on the "urban edge."

1,489 units of affordable rental and ownership housing for families developed and preserved

82,500 square feet of neighborhoodscale retail and community facilities generated

1,250 new homeowners created through our First-Time Homebuyer Workshops

900 families spared from losing their homes through our Foreclosure Prevention Counseling

691 individuals now more budget-savvy because of our Financial Fitness classes

87 youth enrolled in our Summer and After-School Youth Leadership Academy

187 student loan borrowers now in effective repayment solutions as a result of our Student Loan Borrower Repayment Counseling Program
